** S is valid only if this is the student's first additional school year.

*** Students who have not met completion requirements are retained. Their year of completion is marked by a W06, W07, W08, , W09, W10, W27, WFT, WFW, WGA, WGD, WRW, WXL, WXT or WXW. If none of these withdrawal code requirements are met, a W23 is assigned at the end of the school year in which the student turns 22, or the student's last year of attendance.

Notes:

Some students may complete all requirements for a standard diploma except for earning the required GPA or passing the required assessments at the end of the 180-day school year. Some of these students may decide to attend summer school to improve their skills and possibly earn a standard diploma.

Title 34, Code of Federal Regulations (CRF) Section, 300.102(iv) has changed. Based on this change, Students with **disabilities** continue to be eligible for FAPE through age 21 if they have not earned a standard diploma, even if they have earned a general educational development (GED) credential. The only exception includes students with disabilities who successfully utilize the Performance-Based Exit Option Model. (Effective 7/30/07) (Non-disabled students who earn a GED are not eligible to attend school for an additional year because a GED is considered equivalent to a Florida Standard Diploma.)

ADDITIONAL SCHOOL YEAR(S)

Section 1003.4282(6)(c), F.S. allows students who do not complete all requirements for a Standard Diploma, but who complete all requirements for a standard diploma except for earning the required GPA or passing the required assessments, to elect to remain in the secondary school either as a full-time or part-time student for up to an additional year and receive special instruction designed to remedy his or her identified deficiencies. If the student chooses to return to school to meet requirements for a Standard Diploma, the student shall be coded with the appropriate Diploma Type and be coded "P" for Grade Promotion Status on the End of Year record.

WITHDRAWAL CODES FOR SUMMER SCHOOL

The withdrawal code for summer school should reflect the status of the student at the end of summer school. If the student did not earn a standard diploma at the end of the regular school year, and then completes all requirements for a standard diploma, enter the standard diploma code (at the end of summer school). If the student attends summer school but does not complete requirements for a diploma, the appropriate withdrawal reason should be entered.

STUDENT END OF YEAR (EOY) RECORD

Only one EOY record is to be reported for the PK-12 student. Therefore, report the "highest" award for the student along with the accompanying withdrawal date of the "highest" award. This is either the award received at the end of the 180-day school year or the award received at the end of summer school. In all cases, the promotion status should be 'P' if the student is awarded a diploma.

PERFORMANCE-BASED EXIT OPTION DIPLOMA

Students earning Performance-Based Exit Option Diplomas must successfully complete all requirements of the district GED Exit Option Model Program and state requirements related to passing the GED, the state approved Graduation Test, or an Alternate Assessment for the state approved Graduation Test.
